0. Preface

This report is focused on the RETHINK project's progress that had been achieved in December 2015. Activities that have been implemented since that time are only mentioned as an exception. The following sources of information have been used:

The structure of the report is as follows: In the first chapter "Comparison of Target State and Current State of the Project in December 2015" project activities from the original work plan and indicators of progress from the original logical framework matrix are contrasted with the achievement or actual project progress at the end of 2015. The second chapter "Deviations According to the Original Work Plan" states deviations only without further comments or recommendations. Comments and recommendations are objective of the third chapter "Conclusions". Some comments on the achievement of quality of contents are objective of chapter four "Quality Assurance with Regards to Content". Derived from chapters one to four recommendations on future actions are summarized in chapter five "Future Actions".

 Upgrade of training methods (PC teachers mobility to EU HEIs) did not start up to now => significant delay; due to the fact there are only 11 months of project duration left and that several double degree programs are ready for enrolment especially for those partner universities training methods upgrade should be completed as soon as possible.

2. Deviations According to the Original Work Plan

Besides the change from joint to double degrees (decision 05/2014 in Chisinau) the above comparison of the target state and the current state of the project indicates some lacks/delays in the project's progress.

"Work package 1 Road Map" has been completed in line with the work plan.

Regarding the development of double degrees "Work Package 2 Rethinking Curricula – Architecture/Urbanism" and "Work Package 3 Rethinking Curricula – Environmental Sciences/Climate Engineering" these work packages are in different progress. The implementation of double degrees in Environmental Sciences/Climate Engineering has achieved considerable progress. Regarding the development of double degrees in Architecture/Urbanism still not all final agreements have been completed and the development of teaching materials has started.

Besides the elaboration and implementation of QAS guidelines most activities of "Work Package 4 Upgrade cluster" are in delay. According to English language skills considerable improvements have been achieved as well but still there are significant gaps at some partners that should be closed as soon as possible in order to provide smooth and efficient project communication with those partners as well. Purchase and installation of communication and e-learning equipment still is in significant delay. It has been completed only at HEIs in Armenia and at HEIs in Moldova, Georgia the process has started. In all further partner countries the purchase of equipment is significantly delayed. There are two different reasons for this delay:

- 1. In several partner countries the formal registration of the project at national authorities still has not been completed (precondition for purchase of equipment inside the country).
- 2. It is a real problem purchasing IT equipment according to the given rules of origin.

Especially for those partner universities that already have implemented the new double degrees the lack of suitable/sufficient IT equipment might cause real problems in realizing their new programs.



According to the upgrade/translation of teaching materials there is a comparable situation. The development of teaching materials on Environmental Sciences/Climate Engineering is still in progress and the development of teaching materials on Architecture/Urbanism just has started. The development of new teaching materials is closely connected with the PC teachers visits to EU HEIs for training methods' upgrade. PC teachers mobility to EU HEIs for training methods' upgrade is in significant default, too.

Regarding "Work Package 5 Quality Statute" Inter-universities visits for quality control have started and they are still in progress. According to the original workplan these visits should have been completed already 09/2015.

Internal monitoring actions in PC and EU are furthermore in good progress and have been complemented by reports on the self-evaluation of the project's progress. In addition reports on the implementation of the dissemination plan and on the implementation of quality assurance guidelines at HEIs in Pc have been presented by Fernando Peña/University of A Coruña. Furthermore Siarhei Piashkun/Polotsk State University has presented an internal quality report based on a questionnaire of all PC HEIs.

Internal monitoring visits to PC HEIs have been realized up to date only in Azerbaijan and reports on these visits are published on the project website. Meanwhile the first double degree programs are implemented and there is the chance to receive a feedback from students enrolled in these programs. Such student's feedback is considered to be fundamental for the evaluation of the programs. Thus it is high time to start the monitoring visits at the other PC HEIs as soon as possible.

External independent evaluations of the project have been accomplished by the National ERASMUS+ Offices Moldova (05/2014, 11/2015), Ukraine and Georgia (03/2015), Armenia (06/2015) and Moldova (11/2015), Azerbaijan (12/2015). According to the project proposal annual independent external audits have been scheduled additionally at the end of each project year. Up to date no such additional independent external audits have been accomplished in charge of the project.

In addition external financial audits had been scheduled at the end of each project year, too. They have not been accomplished up to date as well.

Dissemination activities of "Work Package 6 Expand RETHINK" are in line with original work plan in general. The realization of the repository with scientific/academic/administrative publications has achieved some progress but the content is slanted towards only one journal on CO2 subjects.

According to the report on the level of implementation of the dissemination plan promotion of the new double degrees is in line with the project's progress but significantly behind the working plan (probably because the development and implementation of double degree programs at several project partners is behind the schedule). Application information regarding the new programs is only available on the websites of three project partners.

Although all activities of "Work Package 7 Exploitation and Sustainability" had been scheduled for the third project year some project partners already have achieved good progress in establishing



new Erasmus+ projects, bilateral agreements, contracts with business enterprises as well as in the preparation of the accreditation of new double degrees.

The activities of "Work Package 8 Administration & Management" have been implemented according to the work plan. Unfortunately the formal registration of the project at the national authorities in PC was not explicitly included into the objectives/targets of workpackage 8. Maybe this is the reason why the formal registration of the project not has been completed in all PC (where necessary) up to date.

3. Conclusions

In general the RETHINK project is in good progress (although delayed in comparison to the original workplan according to quite a number of activities) but there are large differences among the partners regarding the project implementation. Several partners already have introduced their new double degree programs, launched their new Double Degree programs in their websites for candidate registration and produced and published information materials on the programs. Others are still in process and some still have to implement many activities in order to achieve the project's targets within the remaining duration of the project. The project management should take special care about those partners who are significantly delayed with the implementation of their double degrees.

These partners should articulate the problems/barriers hindering a quicker implementation of the project at their home institutions and they should ask the project management for intensive support in order to overcome those problems.

The development and translation of new teaching materials still has not yet been completed although several double degree programs already have been implemented. Thus the modernization/adaptation/translation of teaching materials is a very urgent task. It should be supported by and connected with PC teachers' mobility to EU HEIs for training methods' upgrade and this mobility should be prepared as soon as possible, latest until the end of June 2016.

Another problem regarding the project implementation at nearly all PC universities is the purchase and installation of IT equipment in order to establish e-learning modules as important parts of the double degree programs. Probably the challenge is identifying IT equipment providers that are able to provide IT hardware and devices that are eligible according to the certificate of origin. In some PC this problem is closely interlinked with the formal project registration. Unfortunately there is no standard solution. The project management should solve these problems in close cooperation with the PC institutions and the EACEA as soon as possible. A solution urgently is necessary in order to support the already operating double degree programs.

The activities of **Work Package 5 Quality Statute** are providing adequate information for the project management board in order to control the project's progress. Additionally the reports on "Implementation of Quality Assurance Systems", "Dissemination Plan: Level of Implementation" prepared by Fernando Peña and the report on "Internal Quality Control" prepared by Siarhei Piashkun provide a rather detailed insight in the actual status of the project implementation at the partner universities. Because these reports are mainly based on questionnaires and desk research their rather positive results should be validated by monitoring visits at the PC universities. The



available information provided by all these quality reports should be sufficient to control the project's progress adequately.

The annual external evaluations that have been scheduled in the original workplan are not suited for providing really valuable additional controlling information from the author's point of view. The reason is, that the available budget (2.500 € per year) is much too small in order to allow a really serious evaluation of the project's progress and quality by an external evaluator. If the project management team insists on an external evaluation this should be done really seriously at the end of the project.

Because of the obligation to carry out an external financial audit covering the entire budget at the end of the project the annual financial audits that have been scheduled in the original workplan are not necessary from the author's point of view. The budget that has been assigned for these annual audits should be used to cover the obligatory final financial audit.

Several dissemination activities are linked to the achievement of other targets that are delayed. In consequence these dissemination activities are delayed as well in comparison to the original workplan although they are in line with the real progress. In any case the project management board should take special care about the implementation of the dissemination plan at all project partners who are introducing new double degree programs.

Regarding the formal registration of the project at national authorities the project management should increase the efforts achieving the registration in close cooperation with the national project partners.

4. Quality Assurance with Regards to Content

The above chapters deal with the project's quality in terms of the project's progress in comparison to the original work plan. Another aspect of quality is quality regarding contents. Content in this sense does not mean the content of the curricula¹ themselves but the process of the implementation of the double degrees.

The process of the implementation of the double degrees has been tracked and reported by the project coordinator Prof. Oksana Turchanina in a presentation in Yerevan 11/2015. Another report on the availability of inputs, the implementation of activities and achievement of planned results and changes in the original plan and programme of the project has been elaborated and presented by Siarhei Piashkun. In addition Fernando Peña has prepared and presented a report on the implementation of the dissemination plan. All those reports/presentations include a breakdown by partners. On the partner's level one can state a differentiated quality of the implementation of the double degrees as well as of the dissemination plan. Although in general a pretty good quality of implementation has been achieved at some partners some space for improvement can be detected. The management board should ask the partners to check the above mentioned reports carefully and to work on quality improvements as far as lacks can be identified.

¹ Regarding the quality of the double degree programs themselves guidelines on a quality assurance system have been developed and provided to all project partners. Based on a questionnaire the implementation of these guidelines has been assessed and presented by Fernando Peña, University of A Coruña in November 2015 in Yerevan.



The above mentioned quality reports are mainly based on questionnaires. They should be validated by on-site monitoring visits. In order to execute these monitoring visits in a proper and comparable manner an interview guideline will be provided by the author on short notice. The on-site interviews of the responsible contact persons should be complemented by systematic surveys of the students enrolled in the double degree programs.

5. Future Actions

Due to the fact that the project's progress that has been achieved by our partners is diverse different future actions have to be prioritized according to the individual progress in each case. In general those project partners who already have implemented their double degree programs should concentrate their efforts on marketing and quality assurance of their new programs, the others should focus their energies on the completion of the double degree agreements and the implementation of the double degree programs. In addition there are several actions that are very important to be implemented very soon.

In the above table only the latest dates of completion have been inserted. If even possible all these activities should be started at once and – if they are not continuous activities they should be completed as soon as possible.

In order to realize a proper preparation and post processing of staff and student mobility participants and organizers should follow the general scheme of pre and post processing of mobility across EU external frontiers which one can find attached to this report. Participants and organizers should be aware that the preparation of a mobility needs a lot of handling time and thus they should start in due time.

Due to the fact that the development of teaching materials is significantly behind the schedule I recommend connecting this activity with the PC teachers' mobility to EU HEIs for training methods' upgrade and implementing this activity as soon as possible.

Internal monitoring visits at PC HEIs not only should be considered as an examination of the partners but as a chance providing individual support and guidance in order to improve and promote the development and implementation of double degree programs. In this spirit it is recommended to realize internal monitoring visits at those PC universities first that still did not implement the double degree programs. At a later stage (09, 10/2016) the results of the monitoring visits can be complemented by questionnaires of students who will have enrolled in the programs then. The monitoring visits at the other PC HEIs that already have implemented their double degree programs should be realized simultaneously to the presence of European students at the PC universities in order to interview the European students personally.
